

DAY I FRANKFURT - WÜRZBURG

Travel from Frankfurt to Würzburg. Along the way visit Mespelbrunn Castle. Arrival at Würzburg, a pretty town on the banks of the Main River. Enjoy a sightseeing tour of Würzburg. One of the tour highlights is a visit to the Residenz Palace in Würzburg. Continue to the Castle Steinburg hotel, set amidst the oldest vineyards of Würzburg. 
DAY 4 AUGSBURG-FÜSSEN-**NEUSCHWANSTEIN**

In the morning visit Linderhof Palace. This is one of the 3 clastles built by King Ludwig II of Bavaria and the only one where he lived for a significant amount of time. Then continue to Oberammergau, a picturesque town famous for its annual Passion Play. Arrival in Munich.





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DAY 2 SUNDAY, WARSAW

A half-day sightseeing tour includes Old Town, beautifully rebuilt after World War II, with the impressive Royal Castle. 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DAY 7 FRIDAY, KRAKOW -LOWICZ - TORUN

After breakfast, we leave for Torun. On the way, we will stop in Lowicz, a typical Mazovian town famous for folk art: colorful costumes and beautiful paper cut-outs. You will be invited for a home-hosted lunch by a local family, whose charming cottage is located at the foot of the former Lowicz Castle. You will be welcomed in a typical Polish way, with bread & salt, and enjoy your meal served by the young married couple in their lovely house. You will have time to talk about their day to day life and have your dessert in a beautiful garden. We continue to Torun, where the balance of the day is at leisure.

DAY 8 SATURDAY, TORUN – GD

In the morning we see the highlights of Torun. It is the birthplace of Nicolaus Copernicus and considered one of the most magnificent historic cities of Poland. Its Old Town has been included in UNESCO's list for its impressive 13th century Town Hall, superb churches and historic streets preserving Torun's past glory. Following lunch on own, we drive to Gdansk. Upon arrival, we take a brief walk through the town's Old Town. Important notes referring Wieliczka Salt Mine: There are total 800 steps to climb of which 350 at the beginning taking you down into the mine. This 350 steps will be changed into lift service [the service depends on lift technical conditions).

Make sure to put on comfortable shoes. The visit is always conducted under the supervision of local guide (the Miner) - obligatory.

The temperature underground falls within the range of 17-18°C, regardless of the season. We advise you to dress appropriately taking the above in mind.

DAY 9 SUNDAY, GDANSK -GDYNIA - SOPOT - OLIWA

After breakfast we drive to Gdynia, youngest of the tri-city complex, which also includes Sopot the famous and fashionable seaside resort. Here you can still see the oldest and longest wooden pier in Europe. We will also visit Oliwa Cathedral famous for one-of-akind pipe organs.


The balance of the day is free to give you time for shopping Baltic arts and crafts, including unique amber jewelry and trinkets.

DAY 10 MONDAY, GDANSK -**WARSAW**

Today we tour Gdansk in depth. We start from the Upland Gate - a fragment of the city's former fortifications and one of its main gates. Just behind it, we pass by a baked-brick construction consisting of the Prison Tower and the Torture House. The Golden Gate, situated next to the Prison Tower, opens onto Long Market - a magnificent street, with grand mansions decorated with late Renaissance and Baroque facades. Next, we come upon the Main Town and the Artus Court - a building used for Hanseatic League meetings. Just behind it stands the tower of St. Mary's Basilica, a part of the most precious and largest red-brick Gothic churches in Gdansk. On our way back we pass by Mariacka Street, with its gabled terraced houses and elegant boutiques.



Lunch will be served at a local restaurant. En route to Krakow, we also stop at Auschwitz, site of the concentration camp, where millions lost their lives in the crematoria during the Holocaust.

DAY 4 TUESDAY, KRAKOW

The morning sightseeing tour will feature Wawel Hill with its impressive Royal Castle and Wawel Royal Cathedral. Continue the tour with the walk to the Old Town with its restored Main Square of magnificent houses and palaces. There, you stop at St. Mary's Basilica, where to see the magnificent wooden altar by Wit Stwosz. Following lunch on own we will driver to Wieliczka for visiting the Salt Mine. Dinner with a folkloric show will be served at a local restaurant in Wieliczka, before we drive back to Krakow.

DAY 5 WEDNESDAY, KRAKOW – ZAKOPANE

In the morning visit Kazimierz – Jewish Quarter of Krakow, that was established in 1335 by great Polish King Casimir the Greatest. Following lunch on own, we drive to Zakopane beautifully situated at the foot of the Tatra Mountains in the valley between Gubalowka and Giewont.

DAY 6 THURSDAY, ZAKOPANE

In the morning you will have a sightseeing tour of Zakopane, whose wooden architecture blends with the natural landscapes. You will visit the Jaszczurowka Chapel, a great example of wooden architecture in Zakopane. Admire the breathtaking view from the top of Gubalowka, then have time to shop for souvenirs of arts and crafts of the Highlanders in the local shops. DAY 10 MONDAY, TORUN -**GDANSK**

In the morning take a tour of Torun, the birthplace of Nicolaus Copernicus and one of the most magnificent historic cities of Poland. Lunch will be served at a local restaurant in Torun. In the afternoon, we drive to Gdansk, where we will get acquainted with the city on a brief walk through its Old Town.

DAY 11 TUESDAY, GDANSK -GDYNIA - SOPOT

Today we tour Gdansk in depth. We start from the Upland Gate, Prison Tower and the Torture House, The Golden Gate,

situated next to the Prison Tower, opens onto Long Market, Next, we come upon the Main Town and the Artus Court and . Just behind it stands the tower of St. Mary's Basilica. On our way back we pass by Mariacka Street, with its gabled terraced houses and elegant boutiques. After, we will drive to Gdynia - where we will visit Oliwa Cathedral famous for its one-of-akind pipe organs. Finally we will continue to Sopot, the famous and fashionable seaside resort. Here you can still see the oldest and longest wooden pier in Europe.

DAY 12 WEDNESDAY, GDANSK -**OLSZTYN**

After breakfast, we have time at leisure for shopping Baltic arts and crafts, including unique amber jewelry and trinkets. Following lunch on own we will drive to Olsztyn with enroute stopping in Gietrzwald to take part in an open-air picnic with folkloric entertainment.

DAY 13 THURSDAY, OLSZTYN -OLSZTYNEK – LOWICZ – WARSAW

After breakfast short tour of Olsztyn and drive to Olsztynek for visit to the Ethnographic Park. In the afternoon, as we continue our drive to Warsaw with a stop in Lowicz, a typical Mazovian town famous for folk art. You will be invited for a homehosted dinner by a local family, whose charming cottage is located at the foot of the former Lowicz Castle. Keflavík International airport - Reykjavík / approx. 50 km

Arrival at Keflavík International Airport. Transfer by Flybus shuttle without assistance from Keflavík Airport to your hotel in Reykjavík, the northernmost capital in the world. Along the way, you'll pass through lunar landscapes heavily marked by volcanic activity.

Day spent at leisure. Meals on your own (not included).

Overnight at hotel in Reykjavík.

Important: There is no Meet & Greet at the airport and your guide will NOT be present on that day. Transfer to Reykjavík and check-in at the hotel is without assistance. Day and evening spent at leisure in Reykjavík.

Reykjavík – Borgarfjörður – Skagafjörður – Eyjafjörður / approx. 460 km

Pick-up by your guide at the hotel in the morning around 9 a.m.

Departure towards the Borgarfjörður region. The road passes through a tunnel under the mouth of the Hvalfjörður fjord and then turns towards the beautiful Hvítá valley, the "white river." Geothermal activity is intense in some places, as can be seen at the Deildartunguhver site, where a series of micro-geysers spout 180 liters of boiling water per second! Further on, the Hraunfossar waterfalls present an idyllic scene where the clear waters of multiple small cascades merge into the milky flows of the Hvítá river. Slightly upstream, around the Barnafoss waterfall, the riverbed narrows, and we feel the vibrations of its tumultuous rapids.

We then head north through the Höltavörðuheiði moorlands. The road winds between the waters of the Arctic Ocean and landscapes shaped during the last ice age. Marshy moorlands, rounded mountains, and farmland succeed each other until we reach the Skagafjörður fjord region. Here, we make a stop at the Glaumbær folk museum, a charming traditional turf farm with roofs covered in lush grass! The visit will help you become more acquainted with the harsh life of past Icelandic countryside (included). At the end of the day, we cross the Öxnadalsheiði pass, an immense trench carved by glaciers of the last ice age in the Tröllaskagi mountains, the "Trolls Peninsula." The road opens up to the majestic Eyjafjörður fjord, where we will stay for the next couple of nights.

Stop en route for lunch (lunch not included).

Dinner (included) and overnight at hotel in Eyjafjörður and Akureyri area.

Akureyri - Goðafoss - Mývatn - Eyjafjörður / approx. 250 km

We leave the area of Akureyri and the shores of Eyjafjörður for those of Lake Mývatn. On the way, we stop at the Goðafoss waterfall, a beautiful site where the Skjálfandi River has created a stunning arrangement of cascades. Once we reach the Mývatn region, we will make multiple stops at sites that are both surprising and magnificent. The area encompasses a wide variety of volcanic landscapes and natural sites, as well as a rich birdlife.

We'll take a walk amidst the pseudo-craters of Skútustaðir, then navigate through the labyrinthine lava formations of Dimmuborgir, the "dark citadel." Next, we'll visit the geothermal area of Námaskarð, where numerous solfataras, fumaroles, and bubbling mud pots emit strong sulfuric odours. Finally, we'll explore the volcanic zone of the Krafla volcano, where we'll discover the explosive crater of Víti and the extraordinary geothermal area of Leirhnjúkur. It was here that between 1975 and 1984, a series of volcanic eruptions left behind a series of small craters and a vast expanse of black lava.

At the end of the day, before returning to the Akureyri region for the night, we'll visit the Mývatn geothermal baths (included) for a delightful experience in warm, milky waters, in a pool overlooking Lake Mývatn and its surroundings.

Stop en route for lunch (lunch not included).

Dinner (included) and overnight at hotel in Eyjafjörður and Akureyri area.

Húsavík – Ásbyrgi – Dettifoss – Egilsstaðir / approx. 350 km

Departure towards the Skjálfandi Bay and the charming fishing harbour of Húsavík, where you'll have the opportunity to embark on a whale-watching cruise to spot humpback whales, blue whales, and other white-beaked dolphins that inhabit the bay (optional with supplement). Alternatively, for those not enticed by a whale-watching cruise, there's the option to visit the GeoSea geothermal baths (optional with supplement).

We then circumnavigate the Tjörnes Peninsula along a road that overlooks the waters of the Arctic Ocean before descending towards the Öxarfjörður Bay. There, we go for a stroll in Ásbyrgi, an impressive horseshoe-shaped gorge and former bed of the great glacial river Jökulsá á Fjöllum. It's the same turbulent river that we will later discover in its present course, specifically at Dettifoss, Europe's most powerful waterfall, which marks the beginning of the stunning Jökulsárgljúfur canyons. Next, we cross the desert regions of Möðrudalsöræfi to reach to the more fertile region of Hérað and Lake Lagarfljót. It is said that an aquatic monster lives in the waters of this lake... Perhaps a distant cousin of the Loch Ness Monster?

Stop en route for lunch (lunch not included).

Dinner (included) and overnight at hotel in Egilsstaðir area.





Day 5: East Fjords - Höfn / approx. 260 km

Discovery of the stunning East Fjords region. Chains of mountains with steep slopes and sharp peaks separate sparkling fjords that harbor numerous small fishing communities.

The road winds between the sea and the mountains towards the south and the small port of Djúpivogur. Between the Hvalnes and Stokknes capes, we pass through the beautiful Lónsvík bay. Occasionally, along our journey and depending on the season, we might catch a glimpse of a herd of reindeer or observe the graceful flight of swans. As we approach our destination in the Höfn region, we enter the realm of Vatnajökull. With an area comparable to that of the islands of Corsica or Puerto Rico, not only is it Iceland's largest glacier but also the largest in Europe! Stop en route for lunch (lunch not included).

Dinner (included) and overnight at hotel in Höfn area.

Jökulsárlón – Skaftafell – Vík / approx. 280 km

Exploration of Vatnajökull Glacier area, observing numerous glacial tongues along our route. At Jökulsárlón glacial lagoon, the glacier breaks into stunning icebergs that drift peacefully towards the ocean ("Diamond Beach"). The lagoon is situated within a magnificent amphitheatre of glaciers, dominated by the majestic peak of Hvannadalshnúkur, Iceland's highest point (2110m). There, you can embark on an amphibious boat for 30 to 40 minutes, allowing you to cruise through the lagoon amidst the icebergs (optional with supplement).

Further to the west, before crossing the Skeiðarársandur sand plains and reaching the towering cliffs of Lómagnúpur, Iceland's highest at 670m, we discover Skaftafell National Park. Under the gaze of Hvannadalshnúkur, this area is a true oasis bordered by the glacial tongues of Vatnajökull on one side and vast volcanic sand plains on the other.

Later on, we cross the beautiful region of Kirkjubæjarklaustur. Here, we come across the vast Eldhraun lava field, a result of the major Laki eruption that occurred in 1783 and was arguably one of the greatest disasters in Iceland's history.

As we approach the Mýrdalsjökull glacier and the village of Vík, the southernmost in Iceland, we traverse new expanses of black sands.

Stop en route for lunch (lunch not included).

Dinner (included) and overnight at hotel in Vík or Kirkjubæjarklaustur area.

South Coast - Gullfoss - Geysir - Thingvellir - Reykjavik / approx. 300 km

Exploration of the Vík region and its enchanting landscapes, featuring majestic peaks crowned by enormous glaciers, endless shores covered in volcanic black sand, bird-clad cliffs rising like basaltic organs, and lush farmland.

We stop at the shores of Reynisfjara, where ocean waves crash against stunning basalt column cliffs. At Skógar, we discover the powerful Skógarfoss waterfall. Under the watchful eyes of fulmar petrels nesting nearby, we'll feel the powerful mist of the waterfall. We also make a visit to Seljalandsfoss waterfall, as beautiful as it is unique, as it is possible to walk behind it. Before returning to Reykjavík, we make a final detour to explore the sites of the Golden Circle, some of the most famous in Iceland. We visit Gullfoss waterfall, where the Hvítá River plunges into a beautiful canyon in two stages.

Nearby, we wander through the Geysir geothermal area, where the geyser Strokkur shoots water and steam up to nearly 20 meters in the air every 5 to 8 minutes. Finally, we take a walk in Þingvellir National Park, amidst a vast rift plain marked by fissures resulting from the separation of tectonic plates. It's here, specifically at the widest and most beautiful of these fissures, Almannagjá, that Viking chieftains gathered starting in the early 10th century to establish the laws of the land.

Stop en route for lunch (lunch not included).

Dinner on your own (not included).

Overnight at hotel in Reykjavík.

Important: Your guide will drop you off at the hotel upon arrival in Reykjavík but will not be present in the evening or the following day. Evening in Reykjavík spent at leisure.

Reykjavik - Keflavík International Airport / approx. 50 km

Transfer without assistance with Flybus shuttle from your hotel to Keflavík International Airport for your return flight.

Important: Your guide will not be present on this day. Transfer to the airport is without assistance.
